Licensing of XCRI-CAP feed for the University of the West of England

The University of the West of England confirms the principles set out by the XCRI-CAP Course Data programme, as below:

1 It is a principle of XCRI-CAP feeds produced under the Course Data Programme that the data should be freely available to any aggregator or other user, organisation or individual to copy, re-distribute, share, adapt and exploit commercially or otherwise. This document recommends that all such feeds are explicitly licensed under an Open Government Licence (OGL)[1]. This licence grants to the user a worldwide, royalty-free, perpetual, non-exclusive licence to use the information, while providing for acknowledgement of the source of the information. This licence contains no warranty or liability on the provider, and importantly also includes specific non-endorsement clauses. The OGL licence is similar to a Creative Commons licence, but attribution is only needed if the copyright holder makes it a requirement. Where multiple providers are involved, an optional generic statement that 'public sector information' is included, rather than a specific attribution, can be used.

2 It is important that data publishers are familiar with the terms of the OGL for the avoidance of doubt about how the information may be used and the constraints placed on any user. The JISC sponsored document "Licensing Open data: A Practical Guide" June 2011[2] provides a sound overview of the licence landscape.

3 The following information about the licence attached to the data is included in the description element of the catalog element.

The University of the West of England have produced a feed under the following license:
