
PROGRESS UPDATE

The aim of this newsletter is to inform you of our achievements in the past month and to provide a brief update of upcoming events for September.

This past month our focus has been to complete the ground floor concrete slabs and erect the steel frame to the Production Studio. Both of which have been successfully achieved allowing each element to progress further.

Also complete is the erection of the tower crane. We have chosen this method of distribution and lifting due to logistical constraints, another factor is that we reduce significant plant noise otherwise caused by a fork lift or crawler crane.

The tower crane is 36 metres tall and can lift 8 tonnes at 18 metres from the centre of the crane. That's the equivalent of being 8 double deckers tall and lifting the weight of 4 rhinos!



In the coming month you will see the start of the structure which is a reinforced concrete frame for the main building. Our aim is to be pouring concrete at first floor level in readiness to repeat the process up to second floor.

As a team we would like to apologise for the extended closure of Kennel Lodge Rd. This was regretfully due to strong winds when erecting the tower crane.
