English language requirements

All UWE Bristol students must have a recognised English Language qualification. Our preferred tests include IELTS, Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) and Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE).

Please note: Some programmes may have higher English language requirements.

IGCSE English with a score of grade C or above meets our English language requirements in most programmes.

UCE English Language with Credits (3-6) or above is acceptable for undergraduate programmes.

We offer a range of Pre-sessional English language courses, with various durations and fee levels, to help you achieve the required English level for undergraduate and postgraduate study at UWE Bristol.
