Late work '24 hour window'	Enabling you to submit your work up to 24 hours after the deadline. However, there is a marks penalty: Level 0 – 3 A mark of more than 40% for the element will be reduced to 40% Level M A mark of more than 50% for the element will be reduced to 50%	You are not experiencing extenuating circumstances and need no more than 24 hours after the deadline to submit. See the section above on five working day extensions if you are experiencing extenuating circumstances.
Resit / Retake	 Enabling you to continue on a module if you have not passed it yet. After the first sit you are entitled to a resit (this means doing the component/s you have not passed again). Your mark is capped at the pass mark. If after the resit you do not pass, you normally have a second or further attempt. You may enrol on the module again. You will need to take all assessments again and pay for the module again. The module mark is capped at the pass mark. 	You are not experiencing extenuating circumstances and do not submit, or do not achieve the marks required to pass.
