

Screening

for Dyslexia and Specific Learning Difficulties (SpLDs)



What is a screening?

- Screening is an opportunity to find out if you have any indicators of Dyslexia
 or other Specific Learning Difficulties/Differences (SpLDs) such as Dyspraxia
 that are affecting your learning.
- Screening is not a diagnosis of Dyslexia/SpLD. It is designed as a 'safety net'
 to offer you advice and guidance on whether or not you should go ahead
 and book a diagnostic assessment.

What's involved?

- When you book your screening appointment you will be e-mailed a link to an online questionnaire for you to complete and submit.
- You will meet with a specialist screener to discuss your responses to the questionnaire and any concerns about your studies in order to explore any likely indicators of Dyslexia/SpLD.
- The specialist screener may undertake a series of checklists, which will help to indicate the probability of whether or not you have Dyslexia/SpLD.


What if you've already been assessed for Dyslexia/ SpLD in the past?

• If you already have an assessment report from a previous diagnostic assessment you do not need to attend a screening.

How long will it take?

• The screening appointment usually takes an hour.





What should you bring with you?

- Any previous information concerning study skills support and/or examination access arrangements (e.g. readers, extra time, etc.)
- Prescription glasses if you wear them for reading.

What happens after the screening?

- We will discuss the findings and you will receive a short summary report.
- We will offer advice and guidance on the next steps you can take.
- If you decide to book a diagnostic assessment your short screening summary report will normally be forwarded to your assessor.
- Whatever our recommendations, it will always remain your choice whether or not to book a diagnostic assessment.
- Even if we do recommend that you have a diagnostic assessment this does not necessarily mean that you will be found to have Dyslexia/SpLD.

How much does screening cost?

• It is free of charge to attend a screening.
