Balancing revision with relaxation

Coming back to UWE Bristol

Sometimes we find that students find it hard to come back to university after being home for a few weeks over Christmas. A combination of home comforts, a break from lectures and the thought of January exams can make staying at home sound quite tempting!

Usually once a student is back on campus with their course friends and housemates this feeling goes away. However if your student does feel that they can't return to their studies at this time, we'd encourage them to book an appointment with one of our <u>Student Support Advisers</u> (this appointment can be face-to-face or over the phone). They can talk about the different options available to them (such as taking time out), or put them in touch with one of our other support services.

What's coming up in January?

The January exam period runs from **Monday 7 January - Friday 18 January 2019**. Once that's out of the way we start teaching again from **Monday 21 January**. Students can expect their results towards the end of February.

There'll be some new faces on campus, as a new group of students begin their courses in January and February. We'll be sharing our words of wisdom with them through our <u>student</u> <u>newspaper</u>, and they'll be able to get stuck in with The Students' Union's <u>sports clubs</u> and <u>societies</u>.

For new international and EU students we'll also be running our <u>International Student</u> <u>Orientation</u> programme, where students can make new friends and get to know Bristol.

Students who are looking for a new home for the next academic year can attend The Students' Union <u>Accommodation Fair</u> on **Thursday 24 January** - a great opportunity to meet accommodation providers and ask questions on things like contracts and tenants' rights.
