Check your joining instructions

You should have already received your joining instructions via your Welcome Portal. If you've lost the link don't worry - they're also available online.

Read them carefully - they'll tell you when and where you need to register, when your course induction is and whether you need to do any pre-arrival work.

Complete your online registration now

If you haven't already, you need to go to the Registration tab in myUWE to complete the online registration process.

You'll be asked to confirm your details, agree to our terms and conditions and make arrangements to pay your fees.

You'll also need to upload a photo for your student ID card.

Attend the registration session for your course

When you arrive you need to attend your registration session in person. Where and when depends on your course and campus - so check your joining instructions.

If you upload a photo to myUWE before you arrive, you can collect your student card at your registration session. You'll need to bring some photo ID (e.g. passport, driving licence or UK/EU identity card) with you.

You'll also be given a Welcome Pack with a guide to everything at UWE Bristol.

Registration sessions

What to expect during your first week

Your first week will be fun but full on! You'll have a chance to meet your programme leader and other people on your course, as well as spend some time exploring Bristol.

Remember that your course sessions are compulsory. It may be tempting to be out all night, but make sure you're attending any timetabled sessions or you'll fall behind.

Your <u>joining instructions</u> and your timetable (when it's ready) will tell you where you need to be and when.

Check your university email account regularly

Your email address was sent to you along with your username and password - it looks similar to this: firstname@live.uwe.ac.uk. You can also find out what it is by going to your email (via myUWE) and clicking on the person icon in the top right hand corner.

Remember that now you're a student we'll only email your university email account - so make sure you check it regularly. You can also <u>find out how to set it up on your phone</u>.

Throughout the year you'll receive important emails about your course and our fortnightly student newsletter, *yourUWE*, which will tell you about deadlines, support services and events.

Welcome events

Term dates

Standard term dates for the 2016/17 academic year are available online. They'll tell you when teaching starts and ends and when the assessment periods are. You'll need to be available during these times - so don't book a holiday!

Some courses have different term dates - so please check your programme handbook when you get it.

Timetable publication

Most of you will be able to see your teaching timetable from 12:00 (midday) on Wednesday 7 September.

You'll find it under the Courses tab on myUWE.

There are some exceptions where timetables are released earlier or later - so check our timetable publication dates.

Meningitis vaccination

Before you leave home, ask your GP for the Men ACWY vaccination. It protects you against four different causes of meningitis and septicaemia.

Our <u>University Health Centre</u> can still vaccinate you when you arrive, but please try to see your home GP first as we will have limited vaccines available.

You will need to register with the University Health Centre to be given the vaccination there.
