Room numbers

Room numbers at UWE can seem a little confusing at first. Follow this example to find out exactly where to go:

Room number: 2B030

The first number (2) indicates the floor level. The letter (B) is the Block and the second number (030) is the room number. So in this example, 2B030 is on level 2 of B Block, room number 30.

There will be Student Ambassadors around campus in distinctive red t-shirts and hoodies on hand to help if you get lost.
