If things don't go to plan: Extenuating Circumstances

What are Extenuating Circumstances?

Extenuating Circumstances (ECs) are significant personal difficulties or circumstances which may impact upon your ability to complete, submit, or attend a specific assessment (e.g. a piece of coursework or exam).

They are significantly disruptive matters which are outside of your control.

'Extenuating Circumstances' also describes the process the University has in place to help you if you experience such a situation.

Changes to Extenuating Circumstances

The academic regulations relating to Extenuating Circumstances have changed this academic year.

From 1 September 2015, if you submit an assessment (e.g. coursework) or attend an exam, you will not be eligible to submit an extenuating circumstances application. However there are some exceptions to this so take a look at the Extenuating Circumstances webpage to see what they are.
