

Make sure your term-time address is up-to-date

It's really important that we have an up-to-date term-time address for you. Check your address via the myUWE 'My Details' tab - if it's not right, add a new address.

Car parking on campus

We are now a member of the British Parking Association (BPA) Approved Operator Scheme. This means we manage parking enforcement in accordance with the BPA guidelines. Any breach of our parking policy may result in a penalty charge notice and further action as necessary.

Remember that you must display a valid permit to park on any UWE Bristol campus. You can find out if you're eligible to park, where you can park and how to apply for a permit on our car parking webpages. Make sure you apply for a permit as soon as possible.

Reminder: Stoke Lane one-way system

We wanted to remind you that a one-way system is in place on Stoke Lane near Frenchay Campus due to Metrobus works. A diversion is in place via the A4174 (Ring Road).

Cyclists and pedestrians are still able to access Stoke Lane in both directions, but if you're driving you'll need to use the diversion route. <u>Bus services are also affected</u>.

Please allow extra time to get to campus as delays are inevitable.
