
UK government pledges to continue funding support for EU students

The Department for Education has announced that European Union students applying for a place at an English university or further education institution for next year will continue to be eligible for student loans and grants - and will be for the duration of their course - even if the UK exits the EU during that period.

The Department of Education goes on to say that "EU students currently in higher or further education, who are eligible under current rules to receive loans and grants from the Student Loans Company will continue to do so for the courses they are currently enrolled on or about to start this coming year. This includes loans to cover tuition fees (for those resident in the EEA for at least 3 years), loans and maintenance support (for those resident in the UK for at least 3 years or who are EEA migrant workers), and some other grants and allowances."
