
#### Adjustments for January exams

Please note that exam timetables only show the standard duration of the exam - not your extra time. But don't worry - your invigilator will know about your extra time and any other adjustments.

## Check who's registered to vote in your house

Bristol City Council have sent a letter to every house in Bristol to tell you who's currently registered to vote at that property. **You need to check the information** and update it with your name (if it's not already on there).

Each house must reply to the form to say they've checked it - even if the details haven't changed. It's a legal requirement and you could be fined if you don't reply. They'll be visiting properties where the form hasn't been returned.

If all of the details are correct, you can reply quickly online, by phone or by text.
