Make this the year you volunteer

Have you thought about making 2019 the year you get into volunteering?

<u>Volunteering</u> gives you the chance to gain new skills or build on existing ones, make new friends and explore your interests and passions. You can choose something to fit around your schedule, from one-off opportunities to regular ones requiring a couple of hours a week or more.

View all the opportunities (log in required)

Advance notice of a change to submitting coursework with a 5 day extension or reasonable adjustment

At the moment if you've been granted a five working day extension or have a reasonable adjustment to a deadline for an assessment, and it is usually submitted through Blackboard, you have to submit a hard copy of your work.

In response to student feedback, we're working on allowing you to submit your work via Blackboard. We'll let you know a launch date for this - until then, continue to submit hard copies.

Course matters

Missed an assessment or shouldn't have done one?

If you did not submit an assessment or attend an exam, you may be able to use the <u>missed</u> assessment process.

If you submitted / attended but feel you shouldn't have, you may be able to use the <u>removal</u> of marks process. Ask an <u>Information Point</u> for advice and deadlines.

Changing module

You can apply to <u>change any optional</u> <u>modules</u> up until **Sunday 3 February**. You can't change compulsory modules.

If you need advice on your module choices, book an appointment with a Student Support Adviser via an Information Point.

Changing course

If you're thinking about <u>transferring</u>, make an appointment with a Student Support Adviser via an Information Point as soon as possible to discuss your options.

The deadline for transfer requests for courses which start in January is **Sunday 3 February**.

Last chance to submit an abstract for the Student Conference

Share your work through a presentation or poster at our Student Conference. Students from any course or year can get involved.

If you're interested, submit a 250 word abstract by this Friday, 25 January.

It's also a chance to find out more about what else we and UWE Bristol Sport offer and how you can get involved. Plus prizes up for grabs!


