## Working hours during the summer holidays

The student vacation officially runs from Saturday 29 June until Monday 16 September.

**Undergraduate students:** You can work full-time during this period unless your BRP states that work is prohibited. If this is listed on your BRP please come and talk to us as it could be an error.

**Postgraduate students:** The 20 hour per week limit on work continues to apply until you have submitted your final piece of work (typically your dissertation).

## Extending your visa for resits/retakes

If you need to resit or repeat part of your course you may be able to extend your Tier 4 student visa. However, due to immigration legislation, this won't always be possible.

If you need a Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS) for a visa extension, you must complete a CAS request form. Come to a <u>drop-in session</u> where an immigration adviser will complete the form with you and submit it on your behalf.

If you are eligible for a CAS you will also have to meet visa requirements as part of the visa application process. Some of these are time sensitive, so it is a good idea to start to prepare your documents as soon as possible for your visa extension.

## Have you applied for Student Finance for next year?

You need to reapply each year via your funding body (e.g. Student Finance England) as it's not automatically renewed. Reapply as soon as you can to avoid delays in receiving your funding!

#### Work out your degree classification

Find out how your honours degree classification and differential levels of award are calculated.

#### Save any materials you may need

You'll <u>lose access to IT systems</u> 6 weeks after your course ends – including myUWE, Blackboard, your H: Drive and OneDrive. Your UWE live email will remain active for one year.

#### **Download documents from myUWE**

Be sure to download anything you may need from myUWE once you've received your results including your <u>Higher Education Achievement Record</u> (HEAR) - as you'll lose access 6 weeks after your course ends.

#### Prepare to pay council tax

Your <u>council tax exemption will end</u> on Friday 28 June - so after this date you will need to contact your council for an amended bill.

#### **Register for graduation**

Check your email account for your invitation to your award ceremony. You need to <u>let us know if</u> <u>you're coming</u> and buy your guest tickets by Thursday 20 June.
