Before you start

We are looking forward to welcoming you in the week commencing 15 September for Starting Block and the beginning of your programme.

Starting Block will help you settle into university and to help you get to know your teaching team and course mates. We will help you find your way around, get used to our systems, and practise the skills you need to make a strong start. Look out for further emails and explore the Starting Block website with more details.

Your <u>timetable</u> will be available to you via MYUWE (login required) once you have started the registration process. Please visit the <u>'Understanding your teaching timetable'</u> website to find out when your timetable will be published.

Preparing and arrival

You can find everything you need to know about registration, Starting Block and the start of teaching, on our <u>Preparing and Arrival</u> webpage. Take a look at our website to familiarise yourself with our facilities and services such as the <u>library</u>, <u>study skills</u>, <u>academic support</u>, <u>health and wellbeing support</u> and much more.

Registration

Once you have satisfied all admissions requirements, we'll send you your login details for our IT systems to enable you to activate your university email account. Once your account has been activated, you'll gain access to the MYUWE platform where you can register. Note that your login details for MYUWE are different to those used for the UWE Welcome website. Registration for September programmes will only be open from August onwards. You can find guidance and further information on our Registration website.

ID card - upload your photo now

We can only print your ID card if you have added your photo to <u>MYUWE</u>. To avoid delays, upload your photo as soon as possible. For help, go to our <u>student card guidance</u>.

How to make a successful start to your programme

Specific for your course

In previous correspondence you will have already been informed about our additional requirements which must be completed ahead of Registration and Induction:

- Academic certificates
- Disclosure and Barring Service check
- Occupational Health clearance

Please keep a copy of your Occupational Health Clearance; you should be able to take a screenshot from the portal.

Immunisation

Please read both the <u>Immunisation Letter</u> and <u>Immunisation leaflet</u> prior to commencing your studies.

If any of these requirements are still outstanding, you must send the relevant paperwork to us, as instructed, as soon as possible.

Please be aware that incomplete Disclosure Barring Service and Occupational Health Checks will impact on your ability to access learning materials, attend placements and complete your registration onto your degree programme.

Placement Uniform

Details of how to order your placement uniform online will be sent to you by email soon after you start. This will include guidance to help you take accurate measurements that will be required to process your uniform order. You will also be asked to provide an address where your uniform will be delivered – please ensure that the address you provide is where you will be based when the delivery is made. Uniform deliveries will be made between late October and December. Look out for the email in your UWE email inbox and order your uniform promptly.

Appropriate clothes for practical sessions

During practical sessions you will be practising skills and techniques on your peers, and we recommend that you wear clothing in which you can move about freely. There will be occasions where it is necessary to partially undress (e.g. to shorts or to a vest top/sports bra) to enable you to appropriately observe and assess the area of the body with which you are working and develop the professional skills necessary to ask patients and clients to do the same when working in clinical practice. This will only be done with your consent, and your dignity will be always maintained. We recognise that for cultural, religious, or personal reasons you may not be able to undress. In these circumstances we will meet with you prior to the practical sessions to agree suitable alternative arrangements (for example using privacy screens or wearing other suitable clothing). Please discuss any concerns regarding this with your academic personal tutor. As a guide, we recommend:

- T- shirt/polo top
- Sleeveless T-shirt/vest top/sports bra
- Sweatshirt
- Tracksuit trousers
- Shorts

Goniometer

We recommend that you purchase a goniometer prior to starting the course, for use in the Clinical Anatomy module. Goniometers can be purchased for around £10 online.

Stethoscope

At some stage, you may wish to purchase a stethoscope for use in respiratory physiotherapy teaching and placements. You do not need to purchase this before the start of the course, and further information will be given to you during the relevant module.

Engage with your programme

Start your learning

You may also find it useful to refresh your memory of your previous learning of anatomy and the nervous system to help you be ready to study the first modules. The lower limb will be our starting point for the Clinical Anatomy module, and in the Neuroscience module we will be starting with anatomy and physiology of the nervous system.

Read around your subject

A key skill which is required to achieve a high level of success within your chosen programme is the ability to think critically about key issues and practices. To help you to enhance these skills and be ready to engage with your studies, you should start to read and research around your subject before you arrive. Explore the <u>Library</u> web pages to see the wide range of resources available to you once you become a UWE Bristol student.

- The following resources will also be helpful in developing your academic skills ready
 to start your Physiotherapy Degree: Prepare for Study page on library website. We
 would suggest that you go through the workbooks to help prepare your skills for
 critical thinking, note taking, organisation, and academic writing.
- **Self-reflection:** What are your strengths, needs, opportunities and barriers? This <u>template</u> will help to guide you with this reflection (you will need to use Firefox/Chrome as the browser).

We do not recommend that you buy books before starting the programme as there are diverse ways of learning and different books will appeal to different people. Each module has a reading list which includes access to e-books and journal articles via the UWE library, which will be available when you start.

Some useful resources to look at before you start include:

- The Chartered Society of Physiotherapy (CSP) is our professional body, and the
 <u>website</u> has some great <u>resources</u> to help you prepare. The CSP student group
 are active on various social media platforms, as linked on the website.
- There are lots of podcasts and YouTube channels aimed at student physiotherapists, and the CSP website has a good <u>overview</u>
- Health and Care Professions Council Standards of Proficiency for Physiotherapy (you will receive a digital copy of these during induction week)
