Before you start

We are looking forward to welcoming you in the week commencing Monday 15th September 2025 for Starting Block and the beginning of your programme. Please note that Starting Block activities are confined to the first week on the Optometry Programme and after this, your taught modules will commence. These are **compulsory** weeks where we will give you lots of important information relating to your studies and future career, attendance is recorded.

Starting Block will help you settle into university and help you get to know your teaching team and course mates. We will help you find your way around, get used to our systems, and practise the skills you need to make a strong start. Your <u>timetable</u> will be available to you via <u>MYUWE</u> (login required) once you have started the registration process. Please visit the <u>'Understanding your teaching timetable</u>' webpage to find out when your timetable will be published.

Preparing and arrival

Registration

Once you have satisfied all admissions requirements, we'll send you your login details for our IT systems to enable you to activate your university email account. Once your account has been activated, you'll gain access to the <u>MYUWE</u> platform where you can register. You will receive an email from the University inviting you to register online. ID card - upload your photo now

We can only print your ID card if you have added your photo to <u>MYUWE</u>. To avoid delays, upload your photo as soon as you receive login details. For help, go to our <u>student card</u> <u>guidance</u>.

Engage with your programme

Specific to your course

The Optometry course has additional requirements which must be completed before you commence your studies at UWE. These include:

- Registration with the General Optical Council
- Occupational Health Clearance

Additionally, you must ensure that you bring appropriate attire for you to participate in clinical skills sessions and when on placement.

- In on-campus clinical practical sessions the recommended attire for participation in is a black scrub top and suitable plan black bottoms (such as black scrub bottoms, plain black skirt, plain black loose trousers, plain black jogger bottoms), these can be worn with clean black or white trainers.
- You will also require smart professional business attire for your placement sessions. More information on this subject will be included via email if/when your place at UWE Optometry is confirmed at the end of August.

Further instructions and details of these have been sent to you separately. If you have not received this information please contact your year one lead Zoe Smith to request another copy (contact details at the end of this document).

Read around your subject

A key skill which is required to achieve a high level of success within your chosen programme is the ability to think critically about key issues and practices. To help you to enhance these skills and be ready to engage with your studies, you may wish to start reading and researching around your subject before you arrive. The University has computers on all our campuses for you to use in your studies. These provide access to our core digital learning tools and any specialist software required for your course.
