Before you start

We are looking forward to welcoming you on 15 September for Starting Block and the beginning of your programme.

Starting Block will help you settle into university and to help you get to know your teaching team and course mates. We will help you find your way around, get used to our systems, and practise the skills you need to make a strong start. Look out for further emails and explore the <a href="Starting Block website">Starting Block website</a> with more details.

Your <u>timetable</u> will be available to you via MYUWE (login required) once you have started the registration process. Please visit the <u>'Understanding your teaching timetable'</u> website to find out when your timetable will be published. Once you have access to Blackboard, more detailed module timetables will be available there.

### **Preparing and arrival**

You can find everything you need to know about registration, Starting Block and the start of teaching, on our <u>Preparing and Arrival</u> webpage. Take a look at our website to familiarise yourself with our facilities and services such as the <u>library</u>, <u>study skills</u>, <u>academic support</u>, <u>health and wellbeing support</u> and much more.

### Registration

Once you have satisfied all admissions requirements, we'll send you your login details for our IT systems to enable you to activate your university email account. Once your account has been activated, you'll gain access to the <a href="MYUWE">MYUWE</a> platform where you can register. Note that your login details for MYUWE are different to those used for the UWE Welcome website. Registration for September programmes will only be open from August onwards. You can

find guidance and further information on our Registration website.

## ID card - upload your photo now

We can only print your ID card if you have added your photo to <u>MYUWE</u>. To avoid delays, upload your photo as soon as you receive login details. For help, go to our <u>student card</u> <u>quidance</u>.

### **Teaching Blocks**

Face to face sessions begin on **30.9.25**. Theoretical lectures and discussions will take place on Glenside campus with preparation materials being made available in advance. All musical therapeutic skills need to be taught face to face in small or medium sized groups, and we have other experiential elements that need to be taught together. We will ensure that the teaching environment is safe.

Teaching days are on Tuesdays during term time with the exception of the two-day induction in September (see dates below). Face to face lectures and seminars will usually take place at Glenside campus, with occasional weeks involving online delivery. All face to face and online lectures will be video recorded where possible and available on our online learning environment, Blackboard. This will enable you to go over details from the lectures and seminars. Sometimes there will be short videos to watch and material to be prepared in advance of the teaching day.

### The following key dates should be noted for the MA Music Therapy programme:

Induction: 15-16 September 2025

**Term 1**: 30 September 2025 – 2 December 2025 (Tuesdays only at Glenside)

The observational phase of placements begins first week of November at the earliest. The placement day will be agreed in advance with you. Please wait for further communications about this.

**Term 2**: 13 January 2026 – 26 May 2026 (this includes an Easter break and 3 weeks of assessment)

Individual clinical work on placement ideally starts **first week** of January although this may vary by student to student.

Placements end third or fourth week in May (usually coinciding with school half term).

# How to make a successful start to your programme

### **Specific for your course**

In previous correspondence you will have already been informed about our additional requirements which must be completed ahead of Registration and Induction:

- Academic certificates
- Disclosure and Barring Service check
- Occupational Health clearance

### Please also bring:

- Musical instrument(s) that you specialise in unless it's voice!
- For our occasional online learning, a good headset and microphone are advised.

If any of these requirements are still outstanding, you must send the relevant paperwork to us, as instructed, as soon as possible.

Please be aware that Incomplete Disclosure Barring Service and Occupational Health Checks will impact on your ability to access learning materials, attend placements and complete your registration onto your degree programme.

# **Engage with your programme**

### **Start your learning**

Before beginning your study, we are asking you to complete three tasks:

- Start initial reading see below.
- Work on any musical skills which will be helpful for you. We will send some separate advice on this, and you may also have received some personal recommendations following your audition.
- Start considering what form your personal therapy will take a guidance sheet will be sent shortly. It's a good idea to initiate inquiries as soon as you feel ready, as this can take some time.

#### Read around your subject

A key skill which is required to achieve a high level of success within your chosen programme is the ability to think critically about key issues and practices. To help you to enhance these skills and be ready to engage with your studies, you should start to read and research around your subject before you arrive. Explore the <u>Library</u> web pages to see the wide range of resources available to you once you become a UWE Bristol student.

We do not recommend that you purchase books at this stage as all our recommended reading for the course will be available through the UWE library (most library material is online). reading list for enthusiastic readers will be sent to you along with the skills sheet and observation guidelines.

You are encouraged to make contact with the <u>Centre for Music</u> (CFM), based at Frenchay campus. The CFM has practice facilities, and the opportunity to have instrumental lessons or voice coaching, and the opportunity to join various ensembles.
