# Before you start

We are looking forward to welcoming you in the week commencing 15 September for Starting Block and the beginning of your programme.

Starting Block will help you settle into university and help you get to know your teaching team and course mates. We will help you find your way around the online platforms we'll be using and get used to our systems, as well as practise the skills you need to make a strong start. Your <u>timetable</u> will be available to you via <u>MYUWE</u> (login required) once you have started the registration process. Please visit the <u>'Understanding your teaching timetable</u>' webpage to find out when your timetable will be published.

## **Preparing and registration**

Once you have satisfied all admissions requirements, we'll send you your login details for our IT systems to enable you to activate your university email account. Once your account has been activated, you'll gain access to the <u>MYUWE</u> platform where you can register. You will receive an email from the University inviting you to register online. ## Engage with your programme

## Start your learning

Have a go at these activities to start preparing for your programme.

- We recommend you come to the course with some reflections on your experiences in the conservation sector. What have your experiences been, either lived or from what you've read in academic papers or the news? Your experiences form a part of your learning and we would love you to use and share these with your peers.
- If you have the opportunity to, actively engage in the conservation sector before joining the programme. This could be through paid employment or volunteering. Feel free to speak with people you know working in the sector to understand the issues they face when working on and delivering projects. The more experience and contact with the range of roles, stakeholders and issues you have, the more context this will bring to your learning!

## Read around your subject

A key skill which is required to achieve a high level of success within your chosen programme is the ability to think critically about key issues and practices. To help you to enhance these skills and be ready to engage with your studies, you should start to read and research around your subject before you arrive. Explore the <u>Library</u> webpages to see the wide range of resources available to you once you become a UWE Bristol student.

We encourage you to search for and read relevant literature in advance of joining the programme. This could be using <u>Google Scholar</u>, for example. We do not want to prescribe specific reading at this stage, but encourage you to use key words aligning with the modules (e.g. "effective" + conservation project management, or conservation impact, conservation finance, conservation communication). This will bring up a range of current issues and help prepare you for the degree, as well as getting you in good practice for searching for and reading relevant literature.

## **Refresh your study skills**

If you are returning after a break or are new to study, it might be helpful for you to look at the <u>'Prepare for Study'</u> information which guides you on what to expect from studying at university.

## Get to know each other

We want you to feel as much a part of this exciting degree online as you would be in person. A big part of that is getting to know your fellow course mates and creating genuine, last connections together. Our teaching delivery will provide plenty of opportunities for group activities, where you'll start to get to know each other, and in addition to this, we will organise online social activities across the year.

## In-person residential trip

For those who are able to travel in person, we will host a 3-day residential trip at the beginning of the course. This will be in and around Bristol and will provide an opportunity for you to meet some of your lecturing team and your fellow classmates, as well as give you an immersive experience in conservation action and get to meet the Bristol Zoological Society Conservation Team. The trip will include camping in the beautiful countryside surrounding Bristol, with enjoyable activities centred around conservation leadership, as well as talks from guest speakers.

The trip is optional, and for students unable to come on the trip, we will run equivalent sessions online, as well as an additional online fun social session.

We are currently confirming the dates and will communicate these with you as soon as possible, but it will be held during starting block (15<sup>th</sup> September- 26<sup>th</sup> September). We will provide return transport from UWE Bristol Frenchay to the site, but you would be responsible for travel and logistical costs and arrangements to arrive in Bristol.
