Before you start

Registration

Once you have satisfied all admissions requirements, we'll send you your login details for our IT systems to enable you to activate your university email account. Once your account has been activated, you'll gain access to the [MYUWE](#) platform where you can register. Note that your login details for MYUWE are different to those used for the UWE Welcome website. Registration for September programmes will only be open from August onwards. ID card - upload your photo now

We can only print your ID card if you have added your photo to [MYUWE](#). To avoid delays, upload your photo as soon as you receive login details. For help, go to our [student card guidance](#).

Engage with your programme

Start your learning

We are not expecting you to do much work in advance of arriving at UWE Bristol. However, a very useful thing to do is to start sketching. To do this we recommend that you use an A5 sketchbook (it is portable) and keep a visual diary of your summer; represent what you see or what you experience.

Read around your subject

A key skill which is required to achieve a high level of success within your chosen programme is the ability to think critically about key issues and practices. To help you to enhance these skills and be ready to engage with your studies, you should start to read and research around your subject before you arrive. Get equipped

The University has computers on all our campuses for you to use during your studies. These provide access to our core digital learning tools and any specialist software required for your course. You may have scheduled sessions in computer labs or other specialist facilities, and you will be able to use open-access PCs for self-study. You will benefit from owning a laptop. For smooth operation, we recommend a device with the following minimum specifications:

- **Operating System:** Windows 10 or 11 (64-bit)
- **Processor:** Intel i7, or AMD Ryzen 5 (or equivalent)
- **Memory:** 16GB RAM (32GB is preferable for more demanding tasks)
- **Storage:** 512GB solid-state drive (SSD) or more.
- **Display:** Minimum resolution of 1920 x 1080 pixels
- **Graphics:** A DirectX 11-capable graphics card with Shader Model 5 and at least 2GB VRAM

These specifications provide a good specification for running industry-standard software. For tasks that are more graphics-intensive, a higher-specification laptop might be beneficial. Remember, the University's computer labs and open-access PCs are also available if your device falls short of these specifications. Please note that the University does not endorse any scheme or supplier.

UWE Bristol licenses many specialist software packages for use on personal laptops for the duration of your course. The core software used in your course includes (UWE licence gives you access to these packages, so you do not need to buy them):

- Adobe Suite (Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign)
- AutoCAD
- SketchUp Pro+ V-Ray
- Rhino + V-Ray + Grasshopper3D
- Enscape
- Revit (+ Grasshopper WIP or Dynamo)
- Twinmotion

We require ALL students to have drawing supplies for their course. These items are available at reduced prices from **Artway Creative Supplies** who will deliver it to UWE for you. If you do not wish to purchase the Artway kit, you are welcome to assemble your own, with items of a similar or equivalent specification. You will also need to source your own drawing board, either buying one or using one you may already have; it needs to be at least A2 size. The UWE Project room will have A2 boards to purchase or rent for the year. You may reserve one once you have registered on the Project Room website. The boards will be first come first served, so we highly recommend that you reserve as soon as you confirm your place. The rental cost will be roughly equivalent to the purchase price but will be refunded upon return of the board in good shape at the end of the year. [Access this specific course kit.](#)
