## Engage with your programme

### Start your learning

There is an expectation, when studying at Master Level, that students will adopt a level of self-reliance and maturity with regard to their approach to learning and personal administration. M-Level students should develop a strong ethos of independent study, reading around the subject area to support a higher-level understanding and to actively engage in peer-to-peer discussions.

### Read around your subject

A key skill which is required to achieve a high level of success within your chosen programme is the ability to think critically about key issues and practices. To help you to enhance these skills and be ready to engage with your studies, you should start to read and research around your subject before you arrive.

Here is some suggested basic reading that will (A) help you prepare for the course and (B) become core textbooks to '*have on your shelf at home*' as a future construction industry professional. They need to be the very latest edition, as you may find past publications or second-hand purchase offers are not up-to-date. ### Get equipped

The University has computers on all our campuses for you to use during your studies. These provide access to our core digital learning tools and any specialist software required for your course. You may have scheduled sessions in computer labs or other specialist facilities, and you will be able to use open-access PCs for self-study.

UWE Bristol licenses many specialist software packages for use on personal laptops for the duration of your course. If you are struggling to meet the financial demands of your course, please contact the Student Money Service team for advice and guidance.

These packages will run on Windows devices. We recommend that you have access to a device with the following minimum specifications Enhanced Specification.

Over the duration of the course, there will be the opportunities to visit a 'live' construction site. Students will be required to wear hard hats, high-visibility-vests, gloves, goggles, and safety shoes with a steel toe and midsole when visiting a construction site. With the exception of **site safety shoes**, which students must provide for themselves, the University will provide the other personal protective equipment at no cost to students. Also, for risk assessment purposes, students will be required to complete a medical questionnaire prior to each site visit.
