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Before you start

The Programme Team are looking forward to welcoming you onto campus in the week commencing 22 September for the beginning of your programme.

Your full timetable will be available to you via MYUWE (login required) once you have started the registration process. Please visit the <u>'Understanding your teaching timetable'</u> website to find out when your timetable will be published.

<u>Starting Block</u> is a UWE Bristol initiative that can help you settle into university and get to know our campus, digital resources, and support services. We will help you find your way around, get used to our systems, and practice the skills you need to make a strong start once we meet you, too.

Preparing and arrival

Registration

Once you have satisfied all admissions requirements, we'll send you your login details for our IT systems to enable you to activate your university email account. Once your account has been activated, you'll gain access to the MYUWE platform where you can register. Note that your login details for MYUWE are different to those used for the UWE Welcome website.

Registration for September programmes will only be open from August onwards. You can find quidance and further information on our Registration website.

ID card - upload your photo now

We can only print your ID card if you have added your photo to <u>MYUWE</u>. To avoid delays, upload your photo as soon as you receive login details. For help, go to our <u>student card</u> <u>quidance</u>.

Engage with your programme

There are <u>four</u> activities we want you to engage with before you arrive on campus, as listed below:

1 Start your learning

To succeed within your chosen programme, you will need to think critically about key issues and practices within the discipline. To help you to enhance these skills and be ready to engage with your studies, you should start to research around your subject before you arrive. You might also explore the <u>Library</u> webpages to see the wide range of resources available to you once you become a UWE Bristol student.

3 Position yourself

There two tasks are designed to help you arrive onto your postgraduate programme with a developing sense of purpose – and both will be discussed in the first weeks of your time on campus:

- (i) <u>Prepare a 250-500 word statement that details your ambition for postgraduate study</u>. This may include comment on why you have chosen the programme; the career trajectory you anticipate following your studies; how you imagine the year might stretch or challenge you; what excites you about the opportunities available; any creative or professional influences, ideas or techniques you wish to pursue. You could describe this brief summary as your 'manifesto' for study a framework that will inevitably evolve during your creative development. This will help initiate a conversation at the start of the *Creative Professional Contexts* module.
- (ii) Select and watch two documentary and two drama films. write a brief evaluation of each considering story (subject and structure), visual style/approach and storytelling, emotional engagement and representation of characters and subject. Write a log line for each in under 16 words.

4 Connect with others

Start exploring the film culture in and around Bristol. For example, learn more about why the city has been designated an <u>UNESCO City of Film</u>, what's on at the <u>Bristol Film Festival</u>, and explore the programming of our partner institution, <u>Watershed</u>. Explore the production companies based in the city, and think about connections or introductions that might be relevant to your own ambitions in the industry.

Be prepared
