The changes outlined in this document are presented as follows:

Volume 1 – Undergraduate and Postgraduate Taught Regulations

Change - B1 Masters in Architecture

Clarification that the correct number of credits to achieve a Masters in Architecture (MArch) is 240. In order to achieve the award students must already be graduates of the BA (Hons) Architecture and Planning, the BEng (Hons) Architecture and Environmental Engineering or equivalent.

Update – C6 Suspension of Studies deadlines 2019/2020

| Programme start date | Suspension of Studies |

Change - C7 Withdrawal from a programme

Confirmation that the University can withdraw a student from their programme of study if they have not engaged.

The University may withdraw a student from their programme of study where there is no evidence of engagement and all efforts to secure their re-engagement have failed.

The terms of reference for Award Boards have been updated in the Examining Board Code of Practice to reflect this change.

Change – S1 Academic Appeals

Confirmation that students can submit appeals relating to outcomes of personal circumstance applications **at the time** rather than waiting until after the relevant Award Board has met.

Volume 2 - Postgraduate Research Regulations

Updates

- Updates to the responsibilities for Faculty Research Degrees Committees (**PGR4.2.1R**).
- All Directors of Studies, not just those appointed for the first time, must undertake the required UWE training if they have not previously done so (**PGR8.1.3R**).
- Updates to the regulations regarding changes to the research project (PGR9.3.1R).
- Clarification of the process for awarding higher doctorates (PGR part 1 and appendix PGR APP1), and changes to the submission format for the thesis for the PhD/MPhil (Parts 1 and 13).
