

Phishing emails are increasingly common - remain vigilant

Phishing attacks are increasing globally - up at least a quarter in 2018 compared to the previous year.

We're adding additional protection to your UWE Bristol email account which will block access to malicious links (similar to a virus scanner).

But please remember that this will not stop all phishing emails. Never click on any emails or links that seem suspicious, are unexpected or seem too good to be true, even if you know the sender. Delete them immediately.

Update on the free printing pilot

At the beginning of September, we announced that black and white printing would be free for a trial period until February 2019. This was as a result of a campaign led by your fellow students

We can confirm that the pilot is being extended until the end of the academic year.

However, we've been monitoring print usage closely and have noticed that printing has almost doubled as a result of the trial. As long time champions of sustainability, we want to limit the impact we have on our environment. Therefore, the trial will be reviewed at the end of this academic year, and if printing levels remain high, free printing may be removed. Please remember to only print what you really need.


