




# Apply for Student Finance for next year

# Visas for resits and retakes

If you need to resit or repeat part of your course you may be able to extend your Tier 4 (General) student visa. However, due to immigration legislation, this won't always be possible.

Contact a university Immigration Adviser as soon as possible to discuss your options.

If you need a Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS) for a visa extension, you must complete a CAS request form. Come to a <u>drop-in session</u> where an immigration adviser will complete the form with you and submit it on your behalf.

If you're eligible for a CAS you will also have to meet visa requirements as part of the visa application process. Some of these are time sensitive, so it is a good idea to start to prepare your documents at least three months before you apply for your visa extension.

# Working hours

Regardless of the endorsement on your visa, not all students are allowed to work full time during the holidays.

If you're an undergraduate student, you **are able to work more than 20 hours** per week during the holidays.

If you're a postgraduate taught student you **cannot work more than 20 hours** per week until the successful completion of your course, even during the holidays.
